- 1960 Obtained Candidate of Historical Sciences from the Institute of Oriental Studies, the USSR Academy of Sciences (present Russian Academy of Sciences)
- 1972 Obtained Doctor of Science from the Institute of Oriental Studies, the USSR Academy of Sciences
- 1973-81 Vice-President of the Mongolian Academy of Sciences (MAS)
- 1985-87 Visiting Research Professor at the Institute of Oriental Studies, the USSR Academy of Sciences
- 1987- General Secretary of the International Association for Mongol Studies (IAMS)
- 1988 Visiting Professor at l'Ecole des Hautes Etudes en Sciences Sociales, Paris
- 1991 Visiting Professor at the Indian Historical Research Society
- 1992-93 Visiting Professor at the Institute for the Study of Languages and Cultures of Asia and Africa (ILCAA), Tokyo University of Foreign Studies
- 1996 Awarded the title Honoured Science Worker of Mongolia, the country's highest title in the field of science
