PROFILE

Dr. Padma Subrahmanyam was born in Madras, the center of musical culture in South India. Her father was a film director and her mother was a composer and lyricist. Dr. Padma grew up in artistic surroundings. In her childhood, Dr. Padma started learning Bharata Natyam, the classical dance of India. As early as her teenage years, besides dancing, she also began choreography and her creativity and power of expression were spotlighted from the beginning. In 1965, she received a Master's degree in Music from the University of Madras. Composing music pieces for dance she choreographed, Dr. Padma has had a great influence upon music and dance of India.

Dr. Padma's achievements are in both the theory and practice of dance. By exploring correlations between what is described in Sage Bharata's *Natya Sastra*, the earliest extant literature on dramaturgy, and temple sculptures, Dr. Padma succeeded in reviving an obsolete dance technique and translating it into modern practice. For this contribution, she was awarded her Doctorate (Ph.D.) from Annamalai University. Her energetic research activities have produced many accomplishments in publishing numerous books and research papers and designing temple dance sculptures. In addition, Nrithyodaya, the dance school she directs, produced a documentary TV series. She also choreographs new dance pieces and produces dance dramas. In her works, the ancient traditional dance reincarnated by her research exists in beautiful harmony with modern techniques. Dr. Padma is also a devoted teacher and actively tours to perform in various places including the United States, European nations and Japan.

Dr. Padma has held many important positions such as Consultant-Choreographer for the International Singapore Arts Festival, Board Member of the Sangeet Natak Akademi, or the National Academy of Music, Dance and Drama, and General Council Member of the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) of the Government of India. She continues to make great contributions not only to the world of dance, but also to the enhancement of arts and culture in India.
